- This means that people are a part of the ecosystem too!

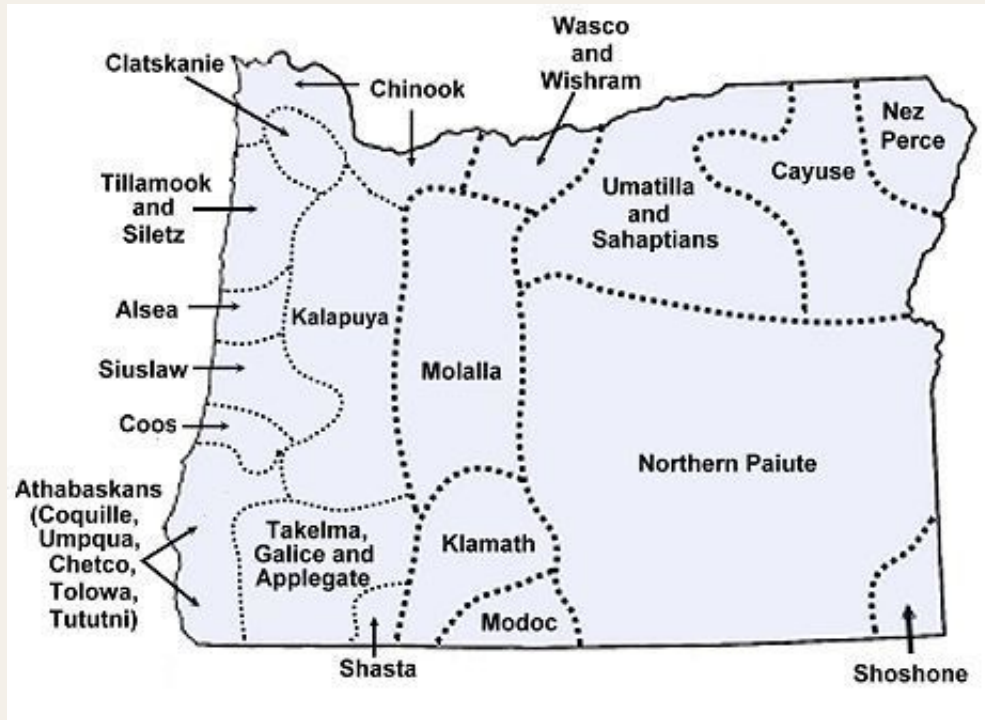

- Today a part of The Confederated Tribes of the Grande Ronde
- Chinuk Wawa is a trade language that the Kalapuya used
